Maine's Alpha One launches the "One in Five" Podcast!

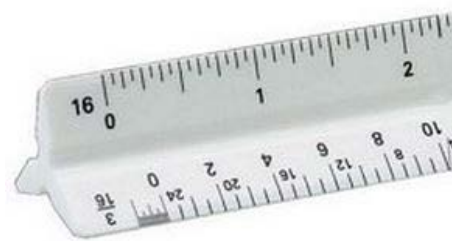

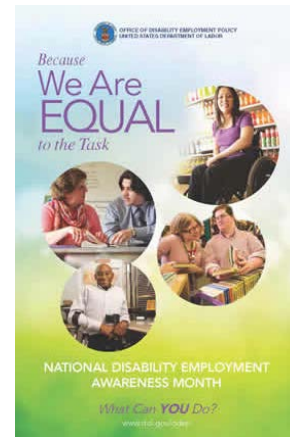

Report: 95% Of Amtrak Stations Have "Major Barriers" For Disabled

More than two decades after the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act, a new survey of Amtrak stations around the country claims that the overwhelming majority still fall far short of being accessible for passengers with disabilities and that some are still completely inaccessible to people who use wheelchairs and other mobility devices.
